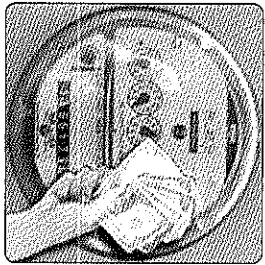


## What is the Weatherization Assistance Program? Who is eligible?

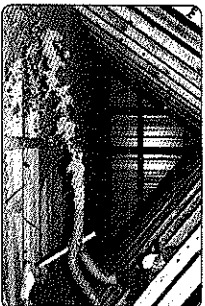

### Applicant must be able to provide:

- Total household income verification for the past 90 days for anyone living in household over the age of 18.
- Copy of eligibility award letter if you receive – Supplement Social Security, State Disability, Michigan Department of Human Service Assistance.
- Proof of home ownership or completed landlord rental agreement.
- Current copy of your completed weatherization application and primary utility bills.

## What is the weatherization process?

**Weatherization is NOT an emergency program. The process can take up to twelve months from start to finish.**

- 1) Apply for the weatherization assistance program.
- 2) You will receive an eligibility letter stating if your application is determined income eligible.
- 3) You will be contacted by Housing & Energy to schedule a pre-inspection of your home.
- 4) You will receive notification with the name of the state licensed contractor who will perform energy conservation measures on your home.
- 5) Once all scheduled work is completed, you will be contacted by Housing & Energy to schedule a post-inspection to review all conservation measures installed in your home.



## Energy Saving Tips

### TO SAVE ON YOUR ELECTRIC BILL:

- Replace light bulbs from incandescent to energy efficient Compact Fluorescent
- Keep the refrigerator and freezer full (even if filling empty juice containers or milk cartons with water) and be sure fridge temperature not too cold
- Unplug unused electronics and appliances
- Use Energy Star Branded items

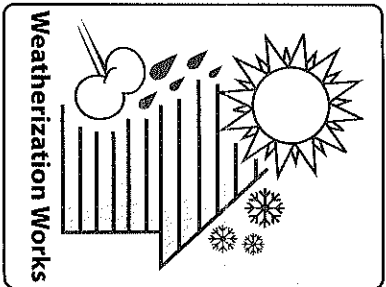
### TO SAVE ON YOUR GAS BILL:

- Replace furnace filter once a month during the heating season
- During the heating season, keep air temperature at coolest comfort level (at or below 71° F) for maximum savings
- During the cooling season, keep air temperature at warmest comfort level (at or above 78° F) for maximum savings
- Use cold water when washing clothes
- Take short showers (5-7 minutes)
- Turn water heater on vacation/pilot setting when out of your home for more than two days

### TO SAVE MONEY ON YOUR WATER BILL:

- Do not run water while brushing teeth
- Take short showers or bathe in tub with water below the knees
- Repair all faucet drips and toilet leaks
- Use an energy efficient showerhead
- Use aerator on bathroom and kitchen sinks
